### **1) Call to Order**

Chairman Joey Shive called the meeting to order. Donnie Perry led the invocation.

### **3) Superintendent Report**

#### **Superintendent Josh Hurt**

- Thanked the board, administration, and leadership teams for a great year. In a way, this year, getting back to normal was more difficult than two years ago. We are in a good place. A lot of people have done good work to get us here, and we have a lot to be proud of.
- Graduation was fantastic, as were the end-of-year ceremonies at each of the schools. Proud of all of our seniors who received scholarships. We had a high graduation rate.
- We had a great year for extracurricular activities, athletics, music, etc. We had some state champions and national competitors. I'm proud of our students, schools, and the community as we continue to do great things.
- We continue to review and monitor our safety procedures. I feel good at where we are with our resource officers and door entries, etc. I want the board and the community to know that safety is a top priority for us.
- At the end of the second year of me being superintendent, I wanted to focus on three things: safety, student experience, and learning. I think we have focused on those three things. We have work to do in all three areas and will continue moving forward.
- On 5C, the wording has changed. I used to be "Bond of Depository." Now it is "Pledge of Collateral."

- 5E, Mr. Moss is asking to consider the Kentucky Office of Vocational Rehabilitation Vendor Agreement. This is no change and will be a continuation of what we have been doing.
- On 5F, we are asking the board to approve a 2% salary increase across the board. That increase, plus the traditional step increases, will result in about a 3% salary increase for most of our employees. We came up with the 2% figure by looking at the SEEK funding that we are expected to receive. I feel this will help Metcalfe County remain competitive in hiring and retention.
- 5J is an agreement to continue services that are already in place with TJ Regional Health. There are no changes.
- Welcome to Cheyenne Perry, the district's new Chief Financial Analyst.
- On 5L, KSBA sends us policy updates. These are the first reads tonight. That won't be official until a second read. Mr. Trotter is working on a District Trauma Plan and Student Discipline Plan. Both are required by law. One part of the policy updates will go into effect immediately: House Bill 563. HB 563 allows for open borders. Students don't have to go to school in their home county. We have permitted open enrollment in the past with limitations, but now the only restriction will be if we reach building capacity. We are not worried about reaching the capacity. If approved, HB 563 takes effect July 1.
- 5M means we have to report the days that we used for NTI last school year.

#### **Michael Gill**

- 21<sup>st</sup> Century Summer Camp started last week. It is running smoothly. Students are still applying. We have a waitlist. We can only take a certain number of students due to staff availability.
- Junior Beta is heading to Nashville for the National Beta Competition at the end of June.
- Beta sponsors, Mrs. Lindsey Thomas and Mrs. Nikki Jolly were named National Beta Educator of Excellence winners for the third year in a row.
- The Beta Club has also been recognized as a National School of Merit and National School of Distinction.
- Our end-of-year programs for preschool, kindergarten and 5<sup>th</sup> grade went very well.
- Our teachers have been working with GRREC on some summer PD.

#### **Clint Graham**

- Prom 2022 went really well. It was the first normal prom since COVID. We had several students attend and stay for an extended period of time. Everyone was safe and appeared to make good decisions.
- Sources of Strength held a color run, games, and cookout on Friday, May 13th, and it went really well. It's becoming a very popular event. I appreciate all the teachers and students involved.
- Senior awards and underclassman awards went great on Monday, May 23rd.
- Senior activities were incredibly smooth and successful. Big thanks to everyone involved.
- MCHS students led an agriculture field day for MCES students, which was very successful.
- Dylan Thurman signed with Campbellsville University for the Marching Band.

- Carlie Howard signed with the University of Kentucky for Cheerleading.
- Devan Alderson signed with Lindsey Wilson College for Track.
- Jaycie Harper signed with Campbellsville University for Flag Football.
- In July, Connor Jessee, MCHS junior, will be competing in the National Rodeo in Wyoming. Good luck.
